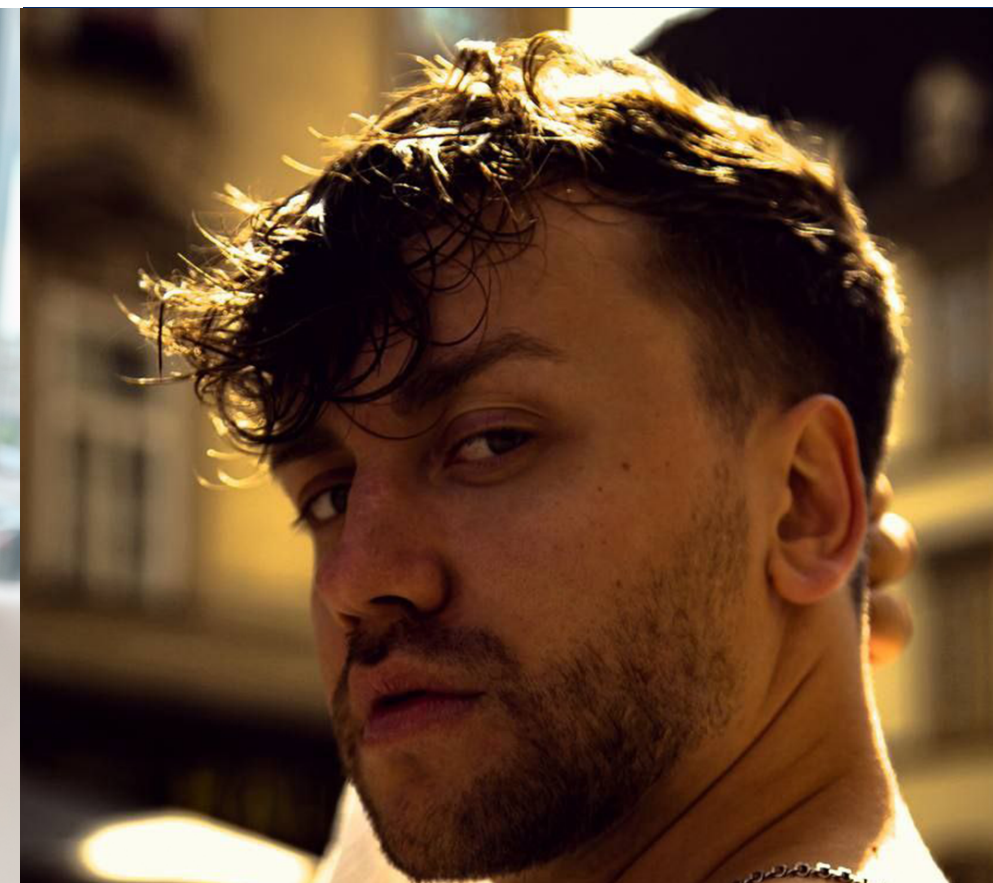

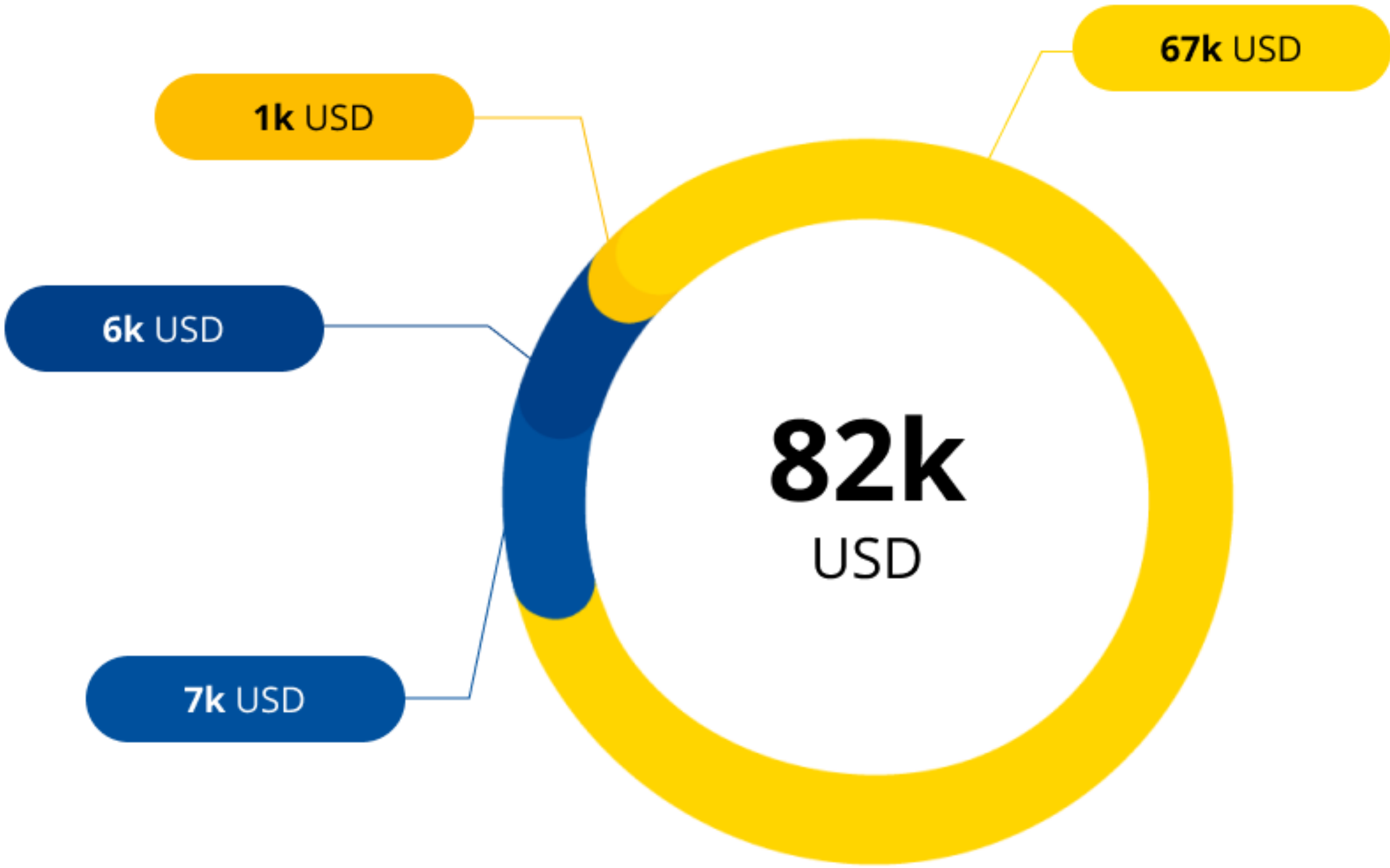

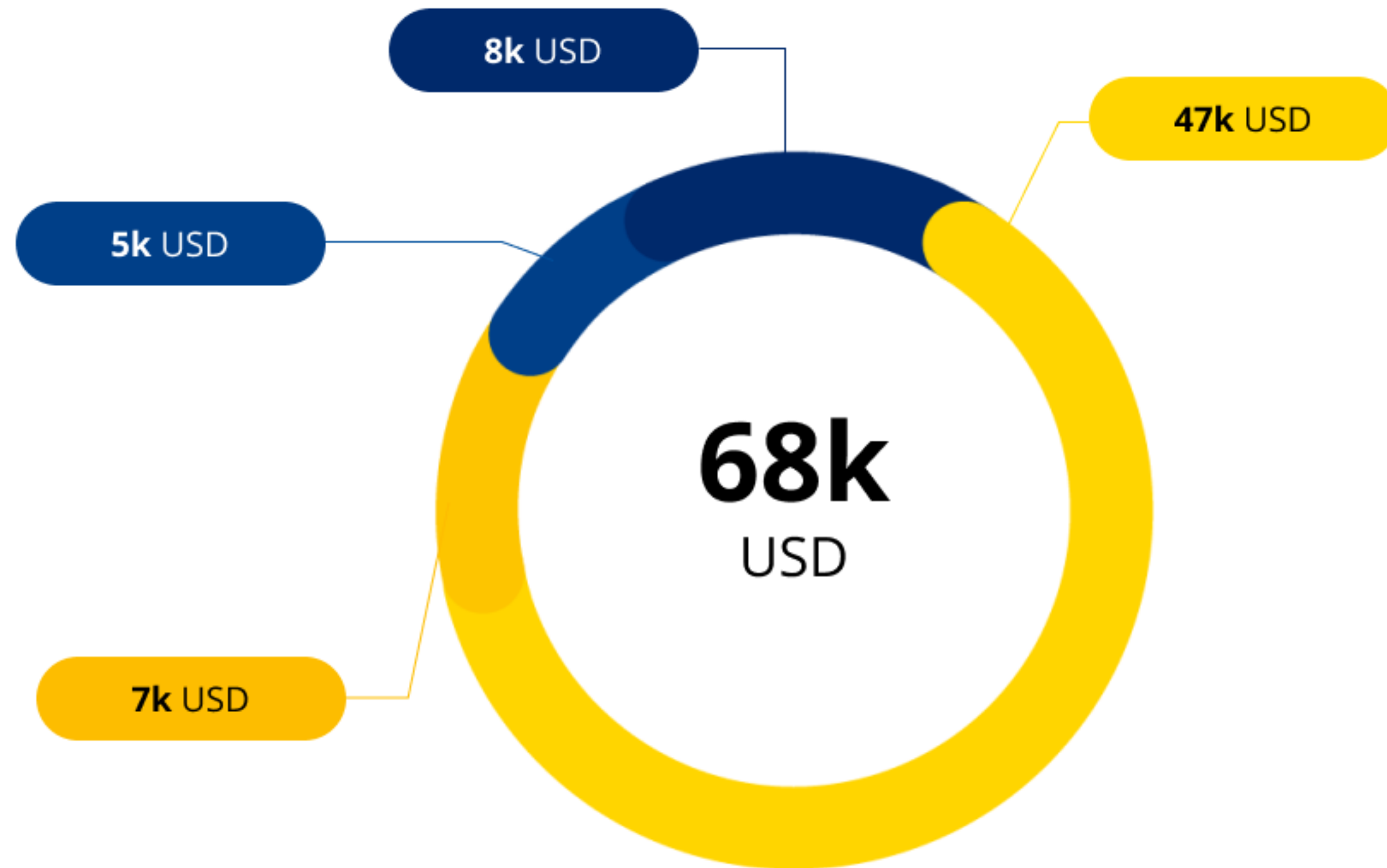
Revenue structure

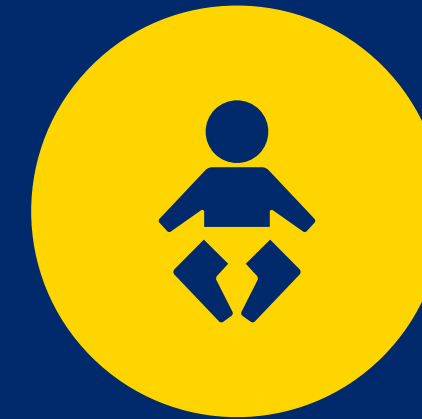

Okhmatdyt

Due to the lack of state funding, the rehabilitation aqua zone of the Okhmatdyt hospital sanatorium at 7/9 Stritenska Street has not been used for 30 years.

As of 9 October 2023, we have raised and transferred **UAH 1456636.90** for the restoration of the aqua clinic to the NGO "Okhmatdyt".

The money was spent on:

- inspection and dismantling of the swimming pool, showers, and changing rooms;
- purchase of building materials for the swimming pool;
- purchase of plastic windows;
- purchase of mosaics for the pool;
- installation of an air ventilation system.

All donations were used in accordance with their intended purpose, and the works were completed.

Medical equipment for Okhmatdyt

The proceeds of **UAH 263,050.00** were spent on Holter ECG monitoring system ECGpro Holter (Lite version) and Holter monitor BS6930-3, as well as 2 cannulated drills (electric drive DK-717, drill attachment, packing case) to the department of microsurgery for osteosynthesis in children with injuries and traumas.

Our foundation covers different parts of Ukraine - Kharkiv, Cherkasy, Dnipro, Kropyvnytskyi - to support children across the country!

Our charitable foundation purchased 530 Christmas gifts for a total of **UAH 37,228.06** and by doing so brought a sense of holidays into their lives.

Supporting people in the war zone

"Hot soup and coffee for everyone!"

The Mission Ukraine Charitable Foundation raised funds in the amount of **UAH 147,400**, organised the delivery of hot soup and coffee together with the NGO "Ukrainian Patriot" and NGO "Women's Movement "Women for the Future".

Thanks to the generosity and support of our American partners were able to provide healthy and enjoyable meals that bring warmth and energy.

Night vision device

Thanks to a generous donation from donors, our foundation was able to purchase a night vision device worth **121,000 UAH**.

Widows of the heroes

As part of our mission of psychological assistance, our foundation cooperates with the NGO of the international community of women "LAGERTA" and its founder Oksana Korolovych. The Wives of the Fallen Heroes project focuses on psychological, social and legal assistance to Ukrainian women who lost loved ones in the war. Many of them have not been able to cope with the grief that befell their families and are now experiencing deep trauma and depression.

Our foundation has donated **139,340.00 UAH** to support the new project "Wives of fallen heroes".

The charitable assistance was aimed at providing comprehensive psychological and legal assistance to women whose relatives were killed in the war. The support was implemented throughout the year. Thanks to this contribution, we provided comprehensive assistance to two women.





Tactical medicine teamed up with the PFVMH

The Mission Ukraine Charitable Foundation delivered medical equipment to the First Pirogov First Volunteer Mobile Hospital (PFVMH). The PFVMH is a non-governmental organisation of civilian medics who provide medical aid at the front line. From the first day of the invasion PFVMH volunteers have been the first to arrive at the battlefields across the country, risking their lives to help wounded civilians and soldiers, and evacuate the wounded. The doctors are volunteers who provided qualified medical care to more than 56,000 patients.

Thanks to our partner, the **Give Live charitable organisation "Daruieste Viata"**, we were able to transfer important medical equipment to the PFVMH, namely:

- two MEDUVENT Standard bases with MEDUCORE Standard on LIFE-BASE 3 NG, an oxygen cylinder and a transport bag;
- one Ascard electrocardiograph;
- one Mesi M electrocardiograph;
- one ACG Tablet electrocardiograph with 12 channels.

The total cost of the equipment is about **57,000 euros**

Medical tourniquets

Thanks to the dedication and passion of our colleague Kirill, we were able to cooperate with the Viennese cafe-restaurant KÄUZCHEN. They have launched an ongoing initiative to support Ukraine by donating a percentage of the sales of certain menu items.

It helped us raise a total of **UAH 21,660.00**. We spent the money to buy life-saving SACH turnstiles, one of the best in Ukraine, which will help save lives. We handed them over to the Pirogov First Volunteer Mobile Hospital.





Mission Alternative

According to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, every child has the inalienable right to a full and decent life.

NGOs Centre for people with combined and their families "Life with an alternative" and "Mission Ukraine have joined forces to ensure a decent life for children with complex motor developmental disorders and created a project called Mission Alternative.

The project program provides targeted assistance to meet the needs for technical rehabilitation equipment. These are wheelchairs, walkers, verticalisers, specialised chairs for home use, equipment for hygiene equipment for hygiene procedures, etc.

With the support of a generous philanthropist Olga and the organisation "Life with an alternative", we purchased a special system for Oleksiy, a boy from Kherson. Together with his mother, he was forced to leave his home and leave behind all the devices that are necessary for his life.

For the amount of **UAH 63910.00**, the required equipment was purchased for the boy and a comprehensive consultation with a doctor was held.

Future plans

"New Start": psychological rehabilitation and assistance to post-traumatic growth of Ukraine

Our next project is the New Start psychological rehabilitation program, developed and led by professional psychologists at Mission Ukraine.

Our goal is to create a psychologically resilient, stable and recovered civil society in Ukraine. We see a future in which community members do not just stand side by side, but have psychological tools and resources for self-support.



Our task is to promote the mental resilience of Ukrainians in the face of Russian aggression and to support the recovery of the country and society after the war. We strive to unite different social groups.

Our beneficiaries during the first phase of the project are volunteers with burnout syndrome: doctors, social workers, psychologists, and everyone who brings victory closer by helping the most vulnerable categories of citizens. We want to support them so that they continue to provide support for those who need it most.

Positive impact:

- **Preventing burnout:** your contribution directly supports the psychological resilience of medics, rescuers and other volunteers.
- **Strengthening the community:** you help create support groups and communities that provide ongoing psychological care and recovery for those who need it most.
- **Supporting victims of the war and volunteers:** By supporting psychoeducation and building effective communication mechanisms, you contribute to a resilient and healthy community.
